# A NOTE FROM PASTOR BILL

#### Senior Pastor

I am a worrier! I always have been. This is because I tend to focus so intently on the future. What do I worry about? Last November, I worried about whether we would make our budget—a worry shared by almost every pastor serving a congregation. I worried about how we would navigate the repair of a leaking roof and the enormous deductible the insurance company was mandating. Recently, I worried about freezing temperatures and how to prevent the fire suppression system from freezing and bursting, along with other pipes throughout our facility.
