# A Note from the Pastor

This newsletter finds me at a quandary - what do I write? Easter Sunday has come and gone. As I ponder the vastness of what I could write to you, I hear the sounds of children cheering from outside. What is going on? The cheering is part of a long journey that our preschool children have undertaken and culminates today.

Many weeks ago, our preschool children and their teachers began this journey with simple caterpillars. They were so very small and fragile. Our children were tasked with raising these caterpillars to see how big they would grow. Indeed, they grew! Our children watched them inch from delicious lettuce leaf to leaf. Things seemed to go so well in the life of a caterpillar luxuriously spoiled by our preschool children. Oh, they were robust caterpillars! Then, the unexpected happened! The caterpillars crafted a cocoon and shut themselves inside. Can vou imagine the disappointment of our children as the caterpillars were no longer inching along, but appearing dead and dormant. All of a sudden, the caterpillars began to emerge, but things did not seem to go as planned. There was some ooze, what appeared to be blood, dripping from the cocoons as the caterpillars were struggling for freedom. Then, as hope seemed to be lost, what emerged was no longer a caterpillar, but a beautiful butterfly.

During this process, I learned that the caterpillars don't just change into a butterfly, but emit an enzyme that causes them to totally melt and from that DNA, a new creature, a butterfly, emerges. What oozed from the cocoon was the remnant of their former being and the evidence of transformation.



This journey reminds me of the love and grace of God. God can overcome what we once were and turn us into beautiful creations that more closely mirror the love and grace of God. Sure, it is a transformative process that requires much effort, and there may be ooze that seeps out from time to time as we become the beautiful image that God helps us to be. Do not lose hope! God's grace and resurrecting power are at work within us bringing the dead and decaying parts to new and vibrant life.

It reminds me of the wonderful promise of God from John 11:25-26 as Jesus says, "*I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though they die, yet shall they live, and whosever lives and believes in me shall never die.*"

At times, we become too focused on the "ooze" of life. We must trust in God's grace to bring about the beautiful creation we are intended to be. Back to our original story about our preschool children. Why were they cheering? Because today they are turning their butterflies loose! Butterflies, lots of them, were soaring into the sky, stretching their wings for the first time, enjoying their newly found freedom. What a lesson for us. It is very tempting to point to the "ooze" of our former selves. God asks us to cheer each other on as we become new creations and find freedom and love. Let's cheer for transformation!

# MUSIC MINIStry He was here... but now He's gone?

May might just be one of my favorite months of the church year, and it's not just because we've made it through Easter. In May (usually, sometimes it's June), we find my 3 favorite Sundays in a row. Ascension Sunday, Pentecost Sunday, and Trinity Sunday.

These three Sundays often are overshadowed by Easter and Christmas, but I find them to be just as important and sometimes even more meaningful than Easter/Christmas. Both Ascension Sunday and Pentecost Sunday celebrate an event in the lives of the disciples and the early church, and set the foundation for the church today. On Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit giving birth to the church. But something happened before that.

The book of Acts begins with the Ascension of Christ, His final act on earth. Before ascending, Christ tells the disciples not to leave Jerusalem and to wait for the promise of the Father. "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all of Judeal and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." What an incredible promise of hope and what a monumental task. And then right after Christ had told them this, he was lifted up and a cloud took him out of their sight. The disciples stand there looking up and wondering what to do.

What would you do in that situation? It has only been 40 days since Christ was raised from the dead. There was so much turmoil, sadness, and fear when he was killed. Then surprise and joy upon his resurrection. We just got him back and now he's gone?

I find comfort in the words of the hymn "On Christ's Ascension I Now Build". This hymn was written in the early 1600's by Josua Wegelin, a Lutheran pastor in Augsburg who had to flee the city on several occasions



due to the decree of Restitution enacted by the Emperor Ferdinand III and due to the battle of Nordlingen. He eventually took refuge in Hungary where he was a pastor and a Doctor of Theology and died at the age of 36 in 1640. Wegelin's hymns are characterized by their simple yet powerful language, their focus on Christ as the center of the Christian faith, and their emphasis on the hope and comfort that believers can find in him. The hymn was translated into English by William M. Czamanske in 1941.

On Christ's ascension I now build the hope of my ascension; This hope alone has always stilled All doubt and apprehension; For where the Head is, there as well I know His members are to dwell When Christ will come and call them.

Since Christ returned to claim His throne, Great gifts for me obtaining, My heart will rest in Him alone, No other rest remaining; For where my treasure went before, There all my thoughts will ever soar To still their deepest yearning.

O grant, dear Lord, this grace to me, Recalling Your ascension, That I may serve you faithfully In thanks for my redemption; And then, when all my days will cease, Let me depart in joy and peace In answer to my pleading.

In this hymn, we are reminded that although Christ has ascended to heaven, we need not be afraid. Through Christ's death and resurrection, he has paved the way for us and we too will one day ascend to heaven. In our time on earth, let us faithfully serve and rest our heart on Him alone until that day when he calls us to heaven.
